RAISING COLTS EXPECTATIONS

The following policies were enacted to focus attention on the value of academic achievement and to increase accountability.

GRADES 6 THROUGH 8

REWARDS

- 1. Each month, students who are passing all their classes, have fewer than 4 total absences and meet behavioral expectations earn the right to participate in COLTS Day Activities.
- 2. Students who meet grade-level growth expectations for ELA and Math Galileo benchmarks will receive a certificate.
- 3. Students who have perfect attendance per quarter will receive a Colt Shoe.
- Students who are Highly Proficient on either ath or ELA sections of the Galileo Benchmark will receive a Colt Shoe.
- 5. Students who are highly proficient on either ELA or Math state assessments receive a block on the Success Wall.
- 6. Students who receive the Principal's List will receive a Colt Shoe. Honor Roll Students will receive a certificate.

REQUIRED INTERVENTIONS

- 1. If at the end of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd grading period, a student has an F in a core course (math, language arts, reading, science, or social studies), the student will be required to complete five sessions of remediation for each failing grade.
- 2. If at the end of the 4th grading period, a student has an F in a core course, the student will be required to successfully attend summer school during summer break. Eighth-grade students who il a core course in the 4th quarter will not be

permitted to participate in promotion activities.

Remediation may include one or more of the following:

- 1. Tutoring Session
- 2. Grade Recovery Session
- 3. Summer school
- 4. Additional academic courses in lieu of Specials or Electives
- 5. Private or Commercial Tutoring pre-arranged or discussed

EXCESSIVE ABSENCES

Regular school attendance promotes learning and achievement; therefore, students who have six or more days of excused or unexcused absences in a quarter will be required to complete 5 sessions of remediation.

CONSEQUENCES

Students who fail to successfully complete the required remediation will be retained.

NOTES

- Special Education students requiring interventions will be referred to the IEP team.
- Students who continue to struggle with meeting expectations will be referred to the Student Intervention Team, and/or a parent will meet with a teacher-led intervention team.
- Students will be treated as individuals, and principals will have the authority to make exceptions.
- Any retention decision may be appealed to the Governing Board, as per board policy.
